## May 11, 2023 Board Meeting Summary

- Approved hiring Amanda Walsh as principal for Zamora Elementary School for the 2023 - 2024 school year.
- Vice President Deborah Bautista Zavala presented a <u>Board resolution in support of Employee Appreciation Month</u>. Woodland Education Association (WEA) Vice President Becca Bernard received it on behalf of WEA; California School Employees Association (CSEA) President Brandi Bolden received it on behalf of CESA; Administrative Assistant of Educational Services Lori Williams received it on behalf of confidential employees; and Freeman Elementary School Principal Dr. Eddie Gonzalez received it on behalf of administrators.
- Trustee Sandra Mott presented a <u>Board resolution in support of Mental Health</u>
   <u>Awareness Month</u> to Freeman Elementary School's Wellness Team: Principal Dr.
   Eddie Gonzalez, Counselor Erika Rodriguez, General Education Behavior
   Specialist Aubrey Bosserman, Cafe Specialist Lizvet Aguilera, and MTSS
   Behavior Analyst Gurpreet Kaur.
- Vice President Deborah Bautista Zavala presented a <u>Board resolution in support</u> of <u>Foster Care Month</u> to WJUSD foster parent Maria Guadalupe Esparza.
- Approved a <u>Target River Marketing Consultant Proposal for WJUSD</u>. Target River Consulting Services will support WJUSD with a six-month public engagement campaign.
- Reviewed the Secondary School Plans for Student Achievement for the 2023-2024 academic year, including <u>Lee Middle School</u>, <u>Douglass Middle</u> <u>School</u>, <u>Cache Creek High School</u>, <u>Pioneer High School</u>, <u>Woodland High School</u>. The plans will come back to the Board for approval on May 25.

- Reviewed a staff update on the <u>Kindergarten Through Twelfth Grade Social Science Curriculum Adoption</u>. Teachers have been engaging in a history/social science textbook pilot this year. Staff highlighted the process used to select, pilot, and reach consensus on textbook recommendations. Staff will be recommending these history/social science textbooks for adoption at the next Board meeting.
- Reviewed New Course Proposals: <u>A) Freshman Seminar- High School Success</u> and <u>B) Advanced Sustainable Agriculture</u>. The Freshman Seminar is a semester-long course that supports students in their transition to high school. The Advanced Sustainable Agriculture course combines an interdisciplinary approach to laboratory science and research with agricultural management principles.
- Took no action to Waive the Community Service Graduation Requirement for the Current Seniors Graduating in June 2023. The Board directed staff to create a resolution on this item for Board consideration at the May 25 meeting.
- Reviewed a staff report on <u>Board Policy Revision: BP 6158 Traditional</u>
   <u>Independent Study</u>. This revision clarifies the differences between Traditional Independent Study and Course-Based Independent Study (CBIS).
- Reviewed a staff report on <u>New Board Policy: BP 6158.1 Course-Based</u>
   <u>Independent Study</u>. This is a new board policy to ensure clarity between the two different types of independent study.
- Tabled the <u>Bid Proposal for Food Service Warehouse Office Construction &</u> HVAC Project for a future meeting.
