None	Chair	-Gangitano shares bringing back Career Day to Lee by working with the AVID department. -Career day used to be part of a class that was offered. Now AVID will be taking over and will have jobs to prepare for this day. -Shares information about the day itself and the schedule for the presenter. -Purpose behind Career day was intended for those students who were not "successful students" to help give a sense of future away from academics (or connection from

	academics to careers).
	-In the class students worked on balancing a budget based on their "income" (given curriculum). Students learned the reality of finances in the future as an adult. To help
	enforce job concept, students punched in like a job clock.
	-Schooling systems need to work on the application of real life skills and not just "how to be a student". Students need to know how to be successful in the workplace.
	-High school has not "work experience" program anymore due to funding in the district.
	-Counseling is supposed to include career readiness, but it is not. New CTE coordinator is supposed to be working on changing this.
	- <u>California Dashboard</u> . This gives a report card for students on career readiness at High school graduation every year.

	-Graduation rates are up. A-G readiness is down. The focus has just been on graduation and not the application after.
	-Career day in the past had previous Lee students sharing their experience.
	-AVID: 1st generation college bound, focuses on College and Career Readiness (which matches the districts philosophy).
	-AVID is now trying to go school wide due to the growth of the program.
	-AVID 8th graders will be the highlight involved in the Career day by completing applications and interviews in order to take a leadership role.
	-Hurt: Find the connection within the disconnect. It is about connecting with the students and helping the students find their niche. Sometimes academics aren't there, doesn't mean there is not a future for them.
	-Jagpal: Sometimes it

			is about the exposure. Students need to be exposed in order to know that this is feasible, challenging but not unattainable. These people exist in our community so let's bring them in. -With school being so expensive these days, it is important to know if this is the career for you. -Is the risk worth the reward? That is the question for students. -Hurt a possible presenter :) -Career Day will be April 19th, Friday before Spring Break.
