1. Welcome

- All members introduced themselves with their name and school/group membership.

2. Introduction to LCAP and LCFF

- The Local Control Funding Formula was established in 2013 as a revision to how school funding is distributed, prioritizing local control and giving districts additional funding to support students who are low income, English learners, and foster youth.
- WJUSD receives base, supplemental, and concentration grant funding due to its high percentage of students who are low income, English learners, and foster youth.
- LCFF also established an accountability system by which districts are measured on the eight state priorities:
 - Basic Necessities
 - Implementation of State Standards
 - Access to Courses

- School Climate
- Student Engagement
- Parental Involvement
- Student Achievement
- Other Student Outcomes
- The LCAP is how the district outlines its goals, actions, metrics, and expenditures to meet the eight state priorities
- 3. Roles and Responsibilities within LCAP
 - The district's responsibilities include: consulting with stakeholders and engaging in comprehensive data review. Additionally, addressing the eight state priorities, and measuring progress on all of the metrics.
 - Members of the LCAP Committee serve as a liaison between the School Site Council/WEA/CSEA/admin team and the district LCAP Committee
 - Review progress
 - Provide feedback
 - The district's role in the committee is primarily to provide information to the committee on the LCAP and other plans, and to share data for discussion
 - The timeline for the Committee's work was shared
- 4. Accountability Update
 - The California School Dashboard will not be published for 2021 due to federal and state action
 - The California Department of Education will publish data on Dataquest (dq.cde.ca.gov)
 - WJUSD reviews data on a regular basis to monitor progress on the LCAP metrics
 - Data currently being reviewed includes:
 - Goal 1 elementary music program enrollment
 - Goal 1 AP test scores
 - Goal 2 universal screening assessments in reading, math, and social-emotional learning
 - Goal 2 monthly ADA reports

- Goal 2 professional development attendance/feedback
- Goal 3 summative ELPAC scores for 2021
