PARENT QUESTIONS

Q. What does least restrictive environment (LRE) mean?

A: By law, schools are required to provide special education in the least restrictive environment (LRE). This means the starting point for discussion should be the supports your child needs to succeed in a general education classroom. LRE is especially important when deciding to place a child in one type of classroom rather than another (placement).
