J. Castro noted that many parents are overloaded with e-mail communication. E. Raya asked about other ways schools have reached out to students prior to this. L. Carrillo described various outreach strategies. E. Raya asked if there was any data about trends. R. Rosssiter asked if these students have been targeted for support in tech access. L. Hunter expressed concern for students who have low attendance being able to engage with procedures. L. Carrillo agreed that supports prior to 4/12 will need to be supported before. L. Soga said everyone is just trying to survive and those parents will need support. Math seems skewed positively due to some instructional passes.
