Phase 2B ended April 2nd. 9 EL students attended in this group and are now in class M,T,TH, F and will have the ability to be in D-3 on Wednesday.  Phase 3 started yesterday. 451 students attended back on campus (about 60%). Students seem to be having a good time back on campus.  Ruben - reported his daughter is very happy to be back in school and is loving being back. Shared concerns about students crossing street at Granada and 3rd and cars not stopping.  L. Carillo said she would talk with SRO to see if we can get any extra help.  M.Llamas- student is staying home on zoom DL. She shared that she is doing ok and it is only day 2 and the only feedback is that teachers are more attentive to those in the room.





Teachers shared they are learning all their technology and trying their best to adapt.

Attendance- Lore shared the pie chart showing attendance by number as of 4/13. 62% have perfect attendance, 4.3% chronic

Grades- Math will have small group interventions on Tuesday and Fridays. Science has dropped quite a bit in how many are getting F's.

SPSA- Need to address the 4 goals and make sure that how we spend our money aligns with goals. Our goals are derived from the LCAP goals.

- Everyone read the goals on their own and asked questions.
- K.Hunter asked if we had to add students with disabilities into the identified needs box. L.Carrillo stated no because this information carried over from last year.
- L.Soga asked if we had other assessments we could be using.
- K.Hunter asked if in goal 1 the PD release time applies to all students and subjects. Student intervention is the umbrella that would address all students.
- R.Rossiter asked if we have a MESA class. L.Carrillo stated we didn't have enough interest last year but we do now and we are looking for a teacher. C. Minor asked if this would help with sections at DMS since the District pays for this and she said no, the district only pays for the materials and program.
- R. Rossiter asked about implementation of the 6 year plan. After J. Holt updates the available courses, additional coordination can occur between high school, middle school, and elementary counselors.



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- K. Hunter asked about how the plan supports students to make choices around college AND career readiness.
- L. Carillo explained how the options allow students to make connections between their interests and longer term planning in the academic setting so that students can exit compulsory education with as many options open to them as possible.
- R. Rossiter asked if the strategies related to PD focused on teachers could be expanded to include paraprofessionals and other staff.
- K. Hunter asked if we can revise identified needs.
- M. Llamas- suggested that we use a realistic number instead of 10% of students meeting standards taking into consideration the current realities of DL.
- The measurement of the goals will be based on this school year.
- L. Carrillo explained that extenuating circumstances appear in the analysis to explain progress towards the goal.
- Adjusted ELA outcome from 10% to 7%.
- L. Carrillo explained some extenuating circumstances in the math department that might support adjusting the math outcome.
- M. Llamas reflected on the impacts of keeping the 10% growth targets.
- K. Hunter recommends keeping 10%.
- K. Hunter asked about the impact of keeping language around the ALC in the Site plan.
- K. Hunter asked about supporting some of the strategies around goal three with language around staffing to support SEL support staff.
- R. Rossiter asked about how students who are working through the MTSS can
